Summary of School District Practices/Activities

Assemblies at Secondary Schools - Recognition of significant events and famous African Americans. Assemblies are planned and organized by teachers, Associated Student Body representatives and Unity and Diversity Club members.

Daily Announcements - Significant historical and cultural events, student literature read to all students. Students share perspectives to help others accept and appreciate people's difference.
